Council Members Present: Steve Harper, Bryant Neal, Brian Carnes, Billy Mosteller, Charlene McGriff, Jose Luis, Stuart Graham.

A quorum of Lancaster County Council was present for the meeting. The agenda was posted in the lobby of the County Administration Building and also on the County website the required length of time. Call to Order Regular Meeting - Chairman Brian Carnes

Chairman Brian Carnes called the regular meeting of County Council to order at approximately 6:00 p.m.

Welcome and Recognition - Chairman Brian Carnes

Chairman Brian Carnes welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation - Council Member Charlene McGriff

Charlene McGriff led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and delivered the Invocation.

Approval of the Agenda

Charlene McGriff moved to approve the agenda. Seconded by Jose Luis. Brian Carnes stated that agenda item **9b**. would be removed until a later date. There was no discussion from

Council. The motion to approve the agenda Passed by a vote of 7-0.

Non-Consent Agenda

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance To Authorize The Execution And Delivery Of One Or More Amendments To The Installment Purchase And Use Agreement And The Base Lease And Conveyance Agreement Each Between Lancaster County, South Carolina, And Lancaster County Public Facilities Corporation; And To Provide For Other Matters Relating Thereto - Passed 7-0 at the August 11, 2025, County Council Meeting. - Dennis Marstall

Brian Carnes opened the Public Hearing for Ordinance 2025-1981 at approximately 6:12 p.m. He noted that no one signed up to speak at the Public Hearing for the Ordinance. There were approximately 31 citizens, including staff members, in attendance during the Public Hearing for this Ordinance. The following speakers came forward to make comments or sent in written comments regarding the Ordinance: None. Brian Carnes closed the Public Hearing at

approximately 6:13 p.m.

Charlene McGriff moved to approve the 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2025-1981. Seconded by Bryant Neal.

Dennis Marstall explained that the Ordinance was to call out 5 of the 64 acres for the Detention Center that was no longer part of the Detention Center project, and would be used instead for a Coroner's Office. Mr. Marstall noted no changes since the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1981.

There was no discussion from Council. The 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2025-1981 Passed by a vote of 7-0.

b. 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1959

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance To Amend The Lancaster County Code Related To The Membership Of The Health And Wellness Commission - *Dennis Marstall*

Jose Luis moved to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1959. Seconded by Charlene McGriff.

Dennis Marstall explained that staff's recommendation was to remove the outside agency appointments on the Health and Wellness Commission, so the membership make-up of the Commission would be 7 members to represent each Council district and 4 at-large members. Council and staff discussed the process for appointing the at-large members.

There was no further discussion from Council. The 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1959 Passed by a vote of 7-0.

c. 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1960

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance To Amend The Lancaster County Code, Chapter 2, Article XI, Division 5, Related To The Lancaster County Community Relations Commission. - *Dennis Marstall*

Jose Luis moved to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1960. Seconded by Billy Mosteller.

Dennis Marstall explained that the proposed Ordinance was to change the name and the purpose of the Community Relations Commission to allow for more community-focused initiatives. Mr. Marstall explained that staff had been in contact with the South Carolina Human Affairs Commission (SCHAC) Community Relations Commission division regarding the relationship between the state agency and the local Commission.

There was no discussion from Council. The 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1960 Passed by a vote of 7-0. Brian Carnes noted that the 2nd Reading of the Ordinance would be placed on the consent agenda at the next regular Council meeting.

d. 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1983

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance No. 2025-1971, Relating To The Appropriation Of Funds And The Approval Of A Detailed Budget For Lancaster County For The Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2025, And Ending June 30, 2026 (FY 2025-2026), To Further Provide For Revenues And Expenditures During The Fiscal

Year; And To Provide For Matters Related Thereto. - *Jamie Privuznak*

Steve Harper moved to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1983. Seconded by Bryant Neal.

Jamie Privuznak explained that the proposed Ordinance included two budget parts: one related to state aid to local libraries and the other related to Capital Project Sales Tax 2 (CPST2) collections. Ms. Privuznak explained that the request regarding the library was to recognize, receive, and appropriate \$16,883 in additional State Aid to County Library funds for personnel expenditures for two existing staff members. Ms. Privuznak then explained that the request regarding CPST2 collections was to appropriate approximately \$1.8 million in CPST2 reserves or excess collections for the purpose of completing two road projects on the provision list: Cleveland Street and Rise Lane. Jose Luis questioned if the funds for Cleveland Street and Rise Lane would be sufficient, and Dennis Marstall stated that the funds should be sufficient, but staff could always pull funds from Capital Project Sales Tax 3 for the Cleveland Street project.

There was no further discussion from Council. The 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1983 Passed by a vote of 7-0.

e. 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1984

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance 2021-1711, Related To A Development Agreement Between Lancaster County And Redwood Indian Land Barberville SC P1., Also Known, "Redwood" To Amend Section 1(A) Of The Ordinance, And To Amend Exhibit B-1, And To Amend Exhibit C, And To Correct Scrivner's Errors In Section 1.02 And To Amend Section 1.10. And Other Matters Related Thereto. - *April Williams*

Charlene McGriff moved to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1984. Seconded by Steve Harper.

April Williams was unable to attend the Council meeting, so Allison Hardin presented on her behalf. Ms. Hardin reviewed the proposed Development Agreement amendments via the County's PowerPoint presentation. Council and staff discussed the reduction in the number of dwelling units and the reconfiguration of lots, the extension of the Development Agreement through April 2031, and impact fees. Stuart Graham questioned what would happen if Council did not approve, and Ms. Hardin explained that the property would die out with the Development Agreement, and it would default back to the original zoning.

There was no further discussion from Council. The 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1984 Passed by a vote of 4-3; Ayes: Harper, Neal, Carnes, McGriff; Nays: Mosteller, Luis, Graham.

f. Public Hearing and 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1985

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance To Amend The Unified Development Ordinance ("UDO") Chapters 7 And 10 To Define The Use Types "Large-Scale Grocery Store" And "Regional Hospital Facility," And Provide For Additional Wall Signage For Both Uses. - *Planning Department Case Number: TA-2025-1306. The Planning Commission recommended approval by unanimous vote and the Planning staff also agreed with the text amendment. - Allison Hardin*

Brian Carnes opened the Public Hearing for Ordinance 2025-1985 at approximately 6:38 p.m.

He noted that no one signed up to speak at the Public Hearing for the Ordinance. There were approximately 27 citizens, including staff members, in attendance during the Public Hearing for this Ordinance. The following speakers came forward to make comments or sent in written comments regarding the Ordinance: None. Brian Carnes closed the Public Hearing at approximately 6:38 p.m.

Jose Luis moved to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1985. Seconded by Stuart Graham.

Allison Hardin explained that there was a typo in the agenda item and noted that the Planning Commission approved *a portion* of the proposal. Ms. Hardin reviewed the proposed Unified Development Ordinance ("UDO") amendment via the County's PowerPoint presentation. Council and staff discussed the Planning Commission's recommendation and the applicant's request regarding the size of wall signage, and how the use of a building determines the signage size restrictions.

Jose Luis made a motion to amend the Ordinance's text to set the max square footage of one wall sign to 250 square feet, and 500 square feet total per building, for large-scale grocery stores. Seconded by Steve Harper. There was no discussion from Council. The amendment Passed by a vote of 7-0.

There was no further discussion from Council. The 1st Reading of Ordinance 2025-1985 Passed, as amended, by a vote of 7-0.

g. Resolution 1299-R2025

Steve Harper moved to approve Resolution 1299-R2025. Seconded by Charlene McGriff.

Steve Harper moved to approve agenda items **8g.**, **8h.**, **8i.**, **8j.**, **8k.**, **8l.**, **8m.**, and **8n.** in globo. Seconded by Jose Luis.

Sabrena Harris reviewed the annual revenue requirement for each district and explained that Council's approval would allow staff to move forward with the levy and revenue collection process.

There was no discussion from Council. The motion to approve agenda items **8g.**, **8h.**, **8i.**, **8j.**, **8k.**, **8l.**, **8m.**, and **8n.** Passed by a vote of 7-0.

Charlene McGriff moved to approve Resolution 1307-R2025. Seconded by Stuart Graham.

Dennis Marstall explained that if approved, the Resolution would direct the County's Planning Commission to conduct the required studies and make a recommendation to Council regarding revising or imposing new impact fees in the County, potentially County-wide, for fire service, law enforcement, emergency medical services (EMS), emergency management, and parks and recreation. Billy Mosteller and Steve Harper reiterated that the Resolution was just to direct the Planning Commission to conduct a study, and nothing was to be approved without coming back to Council for a vote.

There was no further discussion from Council. Resolution 1307-R2025 Passed by a vote of 7-0.

p. Resolution 1308-R2025

Resolution Title: A Resolution Requesting The South Carolina Department Of Transportation To Post Signage Prohibiting Thru Truck Traffic On Carolina Acres Road Between Barberville Road And Harrisburg Road. - *Dennis Marstall*

Jose Luis moved to approve Resolution 1308-R2025. Seconded by Stuart Graham.

Dennis Marstall explained that Carolina Acres Road was a state-maintained road, but the County could send the proposed Resolution to the South Carolina Department of Transportation, to show the County's interest in Carolina Acres Road being designated as a no thru trucks road to help alleviate traffic volume and speeding on the neighborhood road.

There was no discussion from Council. Resolution 1308-R2025 Passed by a vote of 7-0.

q. Resolution 1309-R2025

Resolution Title: A Resolution To Direct County Staff To Take Appropriate Action To Move Forward With The Library Services And Technology Act (LSTA) Grant Award Match, To Execute Such Other Documents As May Be Necessary And Convenient, And To Take Any Other Action As May Be Needed To Carry Into Effect This Resolution. - *Sabrena Harris*

Charlene McGriff moved to approve Resolution 1309-R2025. Seconded by Jose Luis.

Sabrena Harris explained that the Resolution was to approve a required match for a grant that the Lancaster County Library system intended to apply for with the intent to use the grant funds to purchase and utilize book vending machines to improve services for patrons with difficulties accessing the libraries. Dr. April Williams explained that staff was still looking for the right location for the proposed book vending machine with the hope that it would be placed in the northern area of the County.

There was no discussion from Council. Resolution 1309-R2025 Passed by a vote of 7-0.
