Issue for Consideration:

Whether to amend Lancaster County's noise ordinance.

Points to Consider:

The proposed amendments to the noise ordinance provide more discrete guidance to the citizens of Lancaster County concerning activities that constitute loud, disturbing, and unnecessary noise by providing a non- exclusive listing of prohibited acts.

The amendment also reorganizes the existing structure of the ordinance by moving the relevant factors to be considered by law enforcement in enforcement of the ordinance from the "Definition" section to the "Evidence, Enforcement, and penalties section.

The proposed amendments do not impact Section 23-23 "Exceptions."

Section 23-23 recites that the ordinance will still not apply to:

- (1) Noise emanating from a lawfully established business or industry on a fixed site in any unincorporated area of the County of Lancaster except a business licensed for on premise consumption of alcoholic beverages, which business shall be subject to this article.
- (2) Noise emanating from governmental activities, airports and aircraft, railways, emergency signal devices, parades, carnivals, school band practice and performances, school or government sponsored events, or similar activities.
- (3) Noise caused by emergency operations for the immediate safety, health, and welfare of the unincorporated areas of the County of Lancaster and its inhabitants or to restore property to a safe condition following a calamity.
- (4) Noise emanating from construction activities, agriculture activities, tree harvesting or land clearing activities, lawn care activities, or similar activities between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND CHAPTER 23, ARTICLE II OF THE LANCASTER COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED “NOISE”, TO PROVIDE NECESSARY UPDATES TO THE ARTICLE GOVERNING EXCESSIVE NOISE VIOLATIONS IN ANY UNINCORPORATED AREA IN LANCASTER COUNTY.

WHEREAS, South Carolina Code Ann. § 4-9-25 confers upon counties the authority to enact regulations, resolutions, and ordinances, not inconsistent with the Constitution and general law of the State of South Carolina, including the exercise of these powers in relation to health and order in counties or respecting any subject as appears to them necessary and proper for the security, general welfare, and convenience for counties or for preserving health, peace, order, and good government in them; and

WHEREAS, the Lancaster County Council wishes to amend the ordinance which organized and set forth the rules and regulations for Noise in unincorporated areas of Lancaster County;

WHEREAS, Lancaster County Council wishes to provide for the public specific details of what constitutes Noise, the prohibited acts, exceptions, and penalties for violating the Lancaster County Noise Ordinance:

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power and authority granted to the Lancaster County Council by the Constitution of the State of South Carolina and the powers granted to the County by the General Assembly of the State, it is ordained and enacted that:

Section 1. Chapter 23, Article II, Sections 23-21, 23-22, and 23-24 of the Lancaster County Code are hereby amended as follows:

~~Indicates Matter Stricken~~

Indicates New Matter

Sec. 23-21. Definition.

Excessive noise is any loud unnecessary noise which disturbs the peace and quiet of any unincorporated area of the County of Lancaster or which causes disturbance, discomfort, or annoyance to any reasonable person of normal sensitivities in any unincorporated area of the County of Lancaster or which endangers or injures the safety or health of any person or domestic animal in any unincorporated area of the County of Lancaster. This shall include but not be limited to noise made by human voice or mechanical, electric, or electronic machine or device. ~~In determining whether a noise complained of constitutes excessive noise, the finder of fact shall consider all relevant factors, including but not limited to the following:~~

- (1) ~~— The intensity and level of the noise:~~

- (2) ~~_____ The nature of the noise including whether it was usual or unusual and whether it was produced naturally or unnaturally;~~
- (3) ~~_____ The duration of the noise;~~
- (4) ~~_____ The date and time of day or night the noise occurred;~~
- (5) ~~_____ The general characteristics of the area where the noise was produced;~~
- (6) ~~_____ The general characteristics of the area where the noise was heard;~~
- (7) ~~_____ The distance between the source of the noise and the hearer of the noise;~~
- (8) ~~_____ The reasonable expectation of quiet of persons where the noise was heard;~~
- (9) ~~_____ Any prior complaints concerning the noise or its source or the person producing the noise.~~

Sec. 23-22. Prohibited acts.

(a) ~~It shall be unlawful for any person to make or continue or cause to be made or continued any excessive noise in any unincorporated area of the County of Lancaster. It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be continued, any excessive, unnecessary or unusually loud noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others, within any unincorporated areas of the County of Lancaster.~~

(b) The following acts, among others are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this section, but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive, namely:

(1) *Horns, signaling devices, etc.* The sounding of any horn or signaling device on any automobile, motorcycle or other vehicle on any street or public place within the unincorporated areas of the county, except as a danger warning; the creation by means of any such signaling device of any unreasonably loud or harsh sound; and the sounding of any such device for an unnecessary and unreasonable period of time. The use of any signaling device, except one operated by hand or electricity; the use of any horn, whistle or other device operated by engine exhaust; and the use of any such signaling device when traffic is for any reason held up.

(2) *Radios, phonographs, musical instruments, etc.* The using, operation or permitting to be played, used or operated, any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of persons in the vicinity who are not voluntary listeners thereto. The operation of such set, instrument, machine or device between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. in such a manner as to be audible at a distance of fifty (50) feet shall be prohibited.

(3) *Loud speakers, amplifiers for advertising.* The using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated, any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, loudspeaker, sound amplifier or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound which is broadcast upon the public streets for the purpose of commercial advertising or attracting the attention of the public to any building or structure.

(4) *Yelling, shouting, etc.* Yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling or singing on the public streets, particularly between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or at any time or place so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any office, or in any dwelling, hotel or other type of residence, or of any persons in the vicinity.

(5) Exhausts. The discharge into the open air of the exhaust of any steam engine, stationary internal combustion engine, motorboat or motor vehicle except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud or explosive noises therefrom.

(6) Pile drivers, hammers, etc. The operation between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. of any pile driver, steam shovel, pneumatic hammer, derrick, steam or electric hoist or other appliance, the use of which is attended by loud or unusual noise.

(8) Drums. The use of any drum or other instrument or device for the purpose of attracting attention by creation of noise to any performance, show or sale.

(9) Schools, courts, churches, hospitals. The creation of excessive noise on any street adjacent to any school, institute of learning, church or court while the same are in use, or adjacent to any hospital, which unreasonably interferes with the workings of such institution, or which disturbs or unduly annoys patients in the hospital, provided conspicuous signs are displayed in such street indicating that the same is a school, hospital or court street.

Sec. 23-24. Evidence, enforcement and penalties.

- (a) The provisions of this article shall be enforced by the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office.
- ~~(b) The complaint of one (1) or more persons, when combined with the complaint of a law enforcement officer, or the complaint of a law enforcement officer is prima facie evidence that excessive noise regulated by this article has been produced.~~
- ~~(c) A person violating this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine and/or imprisonment as provided by section 1-10 of the Lancaster County Code of Ordinances for a first and a second offense. For a third or subsequent offense a person violating this article shall be punished by a minimum fine of \$250.00 and/or imprisonment as provided by section 1-10 of the Lancaster County Code of Ordinances. Each occurrence shall constitute a separate offense~~
- (b) In determining whether a noise complained of constitutes excessive noise, a law enforcement officer may be required to exercise judgment in determining if a particular noise annoys, disturbs, injures, or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others and is in violation of this article or is sufficiently loud or otherwise so offensive that it would unreasonably disturb other persons in the vicinity. When making such determinations the law enforcement officer shall consider all relevant factors, including but not limited to the following:
 - (1) The intensity and level of the noise;
 - (2) The nature of the noise including whether it was usual or unusual and whether it was produced naturally or unnaturally;
 - (3) The duration of the noise;
 - (4) The date and time of day or night the noise occurred;
 - (5) The general characteristics of the area where the noise was produced;
 - (6) The general characteristics of the area where the noise was heard;
 - (7) The distance between the source of the noise and the hearer of the noise;
 - (8) The reasonable expectation of quiet of persons where the noise was heard;
 - (9) Any prior complaints concerning the noise or its source or the person producing the noise.

(c) A person violating this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine and/or imprisonment as provided by section 1-10 of the Lancaster County Code of Ordinances for a first and a second offense. For a third or subsequent offense a person violating this article shall be punished by a minimum fine of \$250.00 and/or imprisonment as provided by section 1-10 of the Lancaster County Code of Ordinances. Each occurrence shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, subsection or clause of this ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, the validity of the remaining sections, subsections and clauses shall not be affected.

Section 4. Conflicting Provisions.

To the extent this ordinance contains provisions that conflict with provisions contained in the Lancaster County Code or other County ordinances, the provisions contained in this ordinance supersede all other provisions and this ordinance is controlling.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This ordinance is effective upon third reading.

RE: COMPREHENSIVE PLAN STAKEHOLDER COMMITTEE – ORGANIZATION AND SELECTION

Lancaster County recently initiated the Comprehensive Plan rewrite project that will help develop a long-term vision and strategy to guide future growth and community development in the county. As previously discussed with the Council, the plan will be organized into three subareas to ensure recommendations are tailored to the unique character and needs of the different areas in the community. These subareas include the Panhandle Area, Greater Lancaster, and Southern Lancaster County. The boundaries may be refined during the early stages of the project and a map showing their current locations is attached.

Community engagement will be essential to the success of the Comprehensive Plan. This engagement will be centered on the formation of a well-rounded Stakeholder Committee representing a broad cross-section of expertise and local knowledge. This group will serve as the general sounding board for various community issues/needs or proposals that will be discussed during the plan development. To help the committee better understand the individual needs and important topics within the three subareas, separate Focus Groups will be formed within each subarea. It is envisioned that one member from each of the three Focus Groups will serve on the overall Steering Committee.

Attached is an exhibit that outlines the proposed Stakeholder Committee and Focus Group structure. Staff has provided suggested topic areas to be represented on the Stakeholder Committee and where appropriate, suggested organizations to be the subject matter expert on these topics. Staff has also provided suggested organizations to be represented on the individual Focus Groups within each subarea. These organizations have a local presence within the individual subarea and/or may represent an important topic within it. A citizen representative is also included within each Focus Group and will require a specific nomination from Council.

At the November Committee of the Whole meeting, staff will be seeking Council's approval and/or feedback on the following proposed items.

1. Overall Stakeholder Committee and Focus Group structure
2. Topic areas and organizations identified to serve on the Stakeholder Committee and Focus Groups
 - a. Council may propose alternative topic areas or representative organizations. Staff is limiting the Stakeholder Committee to 15-members and the Focus Groups to 5-members each.
3. Nominations for citizen members on the Focus Groups
4. Nominations for which Focus Group members should serve on the Steering Committee

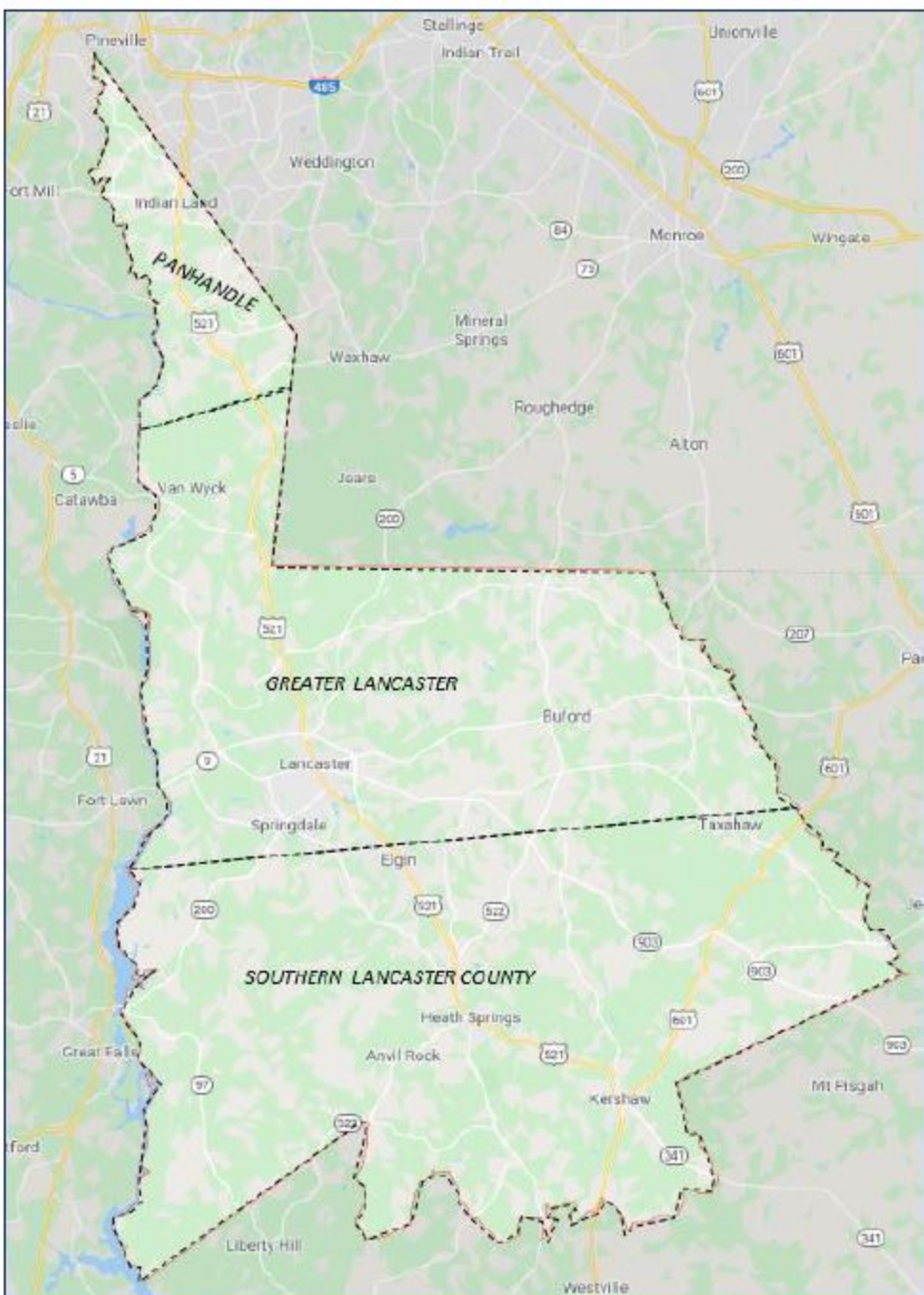
