MINUTES

Council Members present: Allen Blackmon, Brian Carnes, Terry Graham, Steve Harper, Larry Honeycutt, Charlene McGriff and Billy Mosteller.

A quorum of Lancaster County Council was present for the meeting. The agenda was posted in the lobby of the County Administration Building and also on the County website the required length of time. Call to Order Regular Meeting - Chairman Steve Harper

Chairman Steve Harper called the regular meeting of County Council to order at approximately 6:00 p.m.

Welcome and Recognition - Chairman Steve Harper

Chairman Steve Harper welcomed everyone to the Council meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation - Council Member Allen Blackmon

Allen Blackmon led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and delivered the Invocation.

Approval of the Agenda

Brian Carnes moved to approve the agenda. Seconded by Charlene McGriff.

Billy Mosteller moved to amend the agenda to move Item **9d (Information Only regarding Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Application for Grant)** to Item **8a** [*or the first Item on the Non-Consent Agenda*]. Seconded by Larry Honeycutt. The motion to amend Passed 7-0.

Allen Blackmon moved to amend the Non-Consent Agenda to place Item **8h. (1st Reading of Ordinance 2021-1764)** to the first Item on the Non-Consent Agenda. Steve Willis explained that the Airport had applied for a grant from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and that the Airport Engineer suggested that the County use the funds to replace General Fund money used for operations so that those funds could be freed up to purchase either a 6 passenger golf cart or for the grant match for the Airport Terminal project.

Charlene McGriff moved to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2021-1764. Seconded by Larry Honeycutt.

John DuBose reviewed the proposal from the Forfeited Land Commission (FLC).

The attorney for the FLC, Mr. Steve Matthews, provided a history of the Edgewater Development project and explained the current proposal. He further explained that the FLC seemed to be in favor of the current proposal.

Council and staff discussed the take down or draw down schedule for the lot development, the amount of the original bonds spent on infrastructure and what parts of the current infrastructure needed to be replaced.

Mark Boyce, a founding partner of TruHomes, spoke regarding the project's lots values and in which order they would be able to develop the lots.

Council and staff discussed whether the investors for TruHomes were the same as for the previous company and whether the multi-party agreement had been finalized, which it has not.

Michael Seezan, Council bond attorney from the Burr Forman law firm, spoke regarding the modification of the bonds.

After discussion, the motion to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2021-1764 Passed 7-0.

Public Hearing and 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2021-1761 regarding Adopting a School Development Impact Fee

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance Of The County Council Of Lancaster County, South Carolina ("Council") Establishing And Adopting A School Development Impact Fee ("Impact Fee") To Be Imposed On All New Residential Development In The Lancaster County School Panhandle Service Area; To Ensure That School Facility System Improvements Will Be Available And Adequate To Accommodate The Need Expected To Be Generated From The School Children In New Residential Developments In The Panhandle Of Lancaster County School Service Area Based On The School District's Level Of Service Standards And Capital Improvements Plan, And To Assign The Costs Of Such Public School Facilities On A Proportionate Share Basis To New Residential Development In The Service Area; And Establishment Of An Intergovernmental Agreement Between Lancaster County And The Lancaster County School District, To Ensure Proper Implementation And Administration Of The School Development Impact Fee Ordinance

Steve Harper noted that one person signed up to speak at the Public Hearing for the Ordinance.

There were approximately 14 citizens in attendance during the Public Hearing for this Ordinance.

The following speakers came forward to make comments or sent in written comments regarding the Public Hearing for the Ordinance:

1. Jamie Gilbert, Lancaster County Economic Development Director, Lancaster, SC, explained that the Department of Economic Development fully supported the School Impact Fees.

Steve Harper closed the Public Hearing at approximately 7:26 p.m.

Charlene McGriff moved to amend the Ordinance to add an effective date of January 1, 2022. Seconded by Larry Honeycutt. The motion to amend Passed 7-0.

The motion to approve the 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2021-1761 as amended Passed 7-0.

John DuBose provided and reviewed a four (4) page handout entitled, "Event Permit Application," and that handout is attached as Schedule B to the written minutes in the Clerk to Council's office. He explained that the Event Permit Application was in draft form. He reviewed the Ordinance.

Steve Harper opened the Public Hearing for Ordinance 2021-1762 at approximately 7:34 p.m.

Steve Harper noted that one person signed up to speak at the Public Hearing for the Ordinance.

There were approximately 14 citizens in attendance during the Public Hearing for this Ordinance.

The following speakers came forward to make comments or sent in written comments regarding the Public Hearing for the Ordinance:

1. John P. Baker, Heath Springs, SC, explained that he had no problem with the Ordinance but that he did have a minor issue with the disclosure requirements. He suggested that if the open carry was prohibited then the County should disclose the reasoning behind the prohibition. He asked that the following items be added to the Permit Application: (1) disclosure requirements; and (2) physical dimension requirements for signage.

Steve Harper closed the Public Hearing at approximately 7:36 p.m.

Allen Blackmon returned to Chambers at approximately 7:44 p.m. and rejoined the Council meeting.

Discussion and Action Items

Approval of Appointment to the Health and Wellness Commission

- Kylie Craig to the Health and Wellness Commission as the District 7 representative to fill a four year term that would end on 06/30/2025 (1st Term)

Brian Carnes moved to approve the appointment. Seconded by Charlene McGriff. Motion Passed 7-0.

Public Comment on the Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) for 2021 - Steve Willis/Sheriff Barry Faile

Steve Willis explained that the Sheriff's Department had received an annual grant from the federal government and that part of the grant process was to allow for Public Comments from citizens.

Allen Blackmon moved to see if any citizens had public comments regarding the grant. Seconded by Brian Carnes. Motion Passed 7-0.

Steve Harper opened the Public Comments for the Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant at approximately 7:46 p.m.

There were approximately 11 citizens in attendance during the Public Comments regarding the grant.

The following speakers came forward to make comments during Public Comments: None.

Steve Harper closed the Public Comments at approximately 7:47 p.m.

Group Quarters in 2020 Census - Steve Willis

Steve Willis explained that the group quarters had historically been left in the Census count for redistricting. He further explained that the staff recommendation was to leave them alone.

Council and staff discussed the maps for redistricting and a timeline to get them approved.

Potential Discussion on American Rescue Plan (ARP) Items - Steve Willis

Steve Willis explained that the discussion of homelessness would be back on the Council agenda on September 13, 2021.

Steve Willis explained that the glass protective barriers for the remainder of the County Administration building have been estimated to cost approximately sixty five thousand dollars (\$65,000.00) and should not exceed that amount. Council had a one page handout at their seat regarding these costs and that handout is attached as Schedule D to the written minutes in the Clerk to Council's office.

Steve Willis provided and reviewed a two page handout regarding the air purifier respirators and that handout is attached as Schedule E to the written minutes in the Clerk to Council's office. He further explained that the air purifiers would be on State contract. He also noted that this Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) would be eligible for federal funding. Clay Catoe noted that the first order of equipment would last the County for between eighteen (18) and twenty-four (24) months.

Brian Carnes moved that the County move forward on both items. Seconded by Charlene McGriff. Motion Passed 7-0.

Steve Willis explained that both items would come back before Council in a budget amendment Ordinance at a later date.

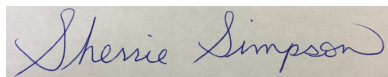
