Call to Order Regular Meeting - Chairman Steve Harper

Chairman Steve Harper called the regular meeting of County Council to order at approximately 6:00 p.m.

Chairman Steve Harper welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Terry Graham moved to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 2021-1761. Seconded by Allen Blackmon.

Brian Carnes moved to amend the motion to substitute the current rates in the Ordinance to the maximum rate proposed by the School District. John DuBose explained, as a point of order, that the current version of the Ordinance did include the full fee amount.

He explained that he would be asking for cost estimates on the glass barriers, air purifiers for EMS and the Coroner's office and for HVAC units.

Suspension of Annual Leave Time Cap - Steve Willis

Steve Willis explained that the County was looking to suspend the annual leave time cap due to COVID.

Charlene McGriff moved that the annual leave cap be amended from two hundred forty (240) hours to three hundred twenty (320) hours for the calendar year 2022. Furthermore, she moved that all employees be notified that the cap will revert to two hundred forty (240) hours on January 1, 2023. Seconded by Larry Honeycutt. Motion Passed 7-0.

Discussion of Constituent Concerns regarding New Indy Paper Mill - Chairman Steve Harper

Chairman Steve Harper explained that Council members were hearing concerns from constituents regarding the odor at the New Indy Paper Mill. He explained that the issue was really a legal question and asked County Attorney John DuBose to explain and review the issue.

John DuBose explained that there was a Consent Motion in place in the federal Courts between New Indy, the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). He also noted, for the record, that in that Consent Motion, New Indy has made no admission of issues or violation of its permit. He further noted that DHEC and the EPA were the agencies tasked with monitoring any complaints regarding New Indy. He also explained that DHEC has a complaint form on its website that citizens should use because it helps them gather data for their investigation and that all citizens should be encouraged to use the DHEC website and forms regarding any complaints. He also noted that DHEC and the EPA were the permitting authorities over the facility and were tasked with environmental enforcement.

Status of items tabled, recommitted, deferred or held

- a. DEFERRED - 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2021-1728 regarding Amending the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) for Outdoor Shooting Ranges/Turkey Shoots

Ordinance Title: An Ordinance To Amend The Unified Development Ordinance (“UDO”) Section 2.5.3, Use Table; Section 5.5.12, Shooting Range, Outdoor; Section 5.12.3, Temporary Uses Limited To Specific Districts; And Section 5.12.4, Temporary Uses With Specific Requirements; To Modify Those Zoning Districts In Which An Outdoor Shooting Range Is A Permissible Use And To Modify Those Regulations Concerning How An Outdoor Shooting Range May Be Permitted, As Well As Providing For Turkey Shoots As A Temporary Use In Certain Zoning Districts And The Standards By Which Turkey Shoots May Be Approved. - ***Planning Department Case Number: UDO-TA-2020-2957. Planning Commission recommended approval by a vote of 5-2. Passed 6-0 at the April 12, 2021 County Council Meeting (Terry Graham Abstained).***

This item was not discussed during the Council meeting and was for information only for Council and citizens.

Miscellaneous Reports and Correspondence

- a. Grant Approval from Commerce

Steve Willis noted that the Department of Economic Development had received a three hundred thousand dollar (\$300,000.00) grant from Commerce and another twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) from Duke Energy to use for the local match.

- b. Government Finance Officer's Association Distinguished Budget Award

Steve Willis recognized Veronica Thompson, Kim Belk and Graham Shuford for winning the Government Finance Officer's Association Distinguished Budget Award.

Steve Harper noted, for the record, that the Council Committee of the Whole meeting scheduled for August 11, 2021 has been canceled.

Citizens Comments

All citizens were heard during the Citizens Comments held at the beginning of the Council meeting.

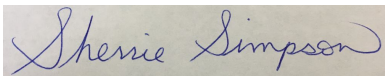
